

Bach Vespers is a ministry of Holy Trinity Lutheran Church (ELCA), a Reconciling in Christ Congregation, welcoming all persons regardless of sexual orientation, race, ethnic origin, gender, class or other possible exclusionary distinction.



The rich tradition of Vespers... as presented at Holy Trinity, is modeled on Bach's practice in Eighteenth Century Germany. Here, his cantatas and other attendant music are presented to modern ears almost 300 years after Bach first began his role as Kantor in Leipzig.

Currently in our 37<sup>th</sup> season, *Bach Vespers* bids you to be part of this living tradition; experience the cantatas in a setting for which they were conceived and created. Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is the first site in America where Bach's cantatas were consistently presented on their appointed days in the context of worship. We continue this practice today!

You are invited to join us for these events, regardless of religious affiliation. Come take part: sit amidst the gentle flickering of candlelight and the sweet fragrance of incense; take in the rhythm of chant; lend your own voice to vibrant chorale singing; reflect on a brief homily linked to the cantata and themes of the day; revel in Bach's great organ works!
