Bach Vespers, the first series of its kind in the western hemisphere, is based on the German service of Vespers for which the great Lutheran composer Johann Sebastian Bach prepared and rendered the vast majority of his cantatas.

Our Bach Choir, Soloists and Bach Players (on Baroque period instruments) are outstanding professional musicians from the New York region and are directed by Cantor Rick Erickson.

Vespers is free and open to all to attend regardless of religious affiliation or beliefs. We do request a free-will offering during the service. Fourth Mondays Concerts have a \$15/\$10 admission at the door and offer a diverse musical presentation beyond our regular cantata renderings.
