The annual Bach Fest Fund Raiser is set for June 19th, 2004, at Chelan's newest Winery, Tsillan Cellars. If you have not seen this magnificent Winery, you are in for a pleasant surprise.

Tsillan is the Native American spelling of Chelan, and is pronounced "Chelan".

The event is scheduled from 7pm to 10pm. We will be tasting the Tsillan Cellars wines complemented by heavy hors d'oeuvres.

Bach Fest musicians will provide the entertainment for the evening, and there will be a silent auction of

select items .

Saturday Concert to be in Riverwalk Pavilion

The second weekend of Bach Fest has traditionally featured Mainstage Concerts on Friday, and Saturday evenings and an afternoon Concert on Sunday.

Each year we get questions from our audiences as to why we don't have any outdoor performances to take advantage of our lovely summer evenings in Chelan. We have been listening!

This year's Saturday evening Concert will be presented at the Riverwalk Pavilion in Chelan, where you can bring a blanket and sit on the lawn to enjoy the performance. Our Music Director has selected music to make the best use of this new outdoor venue in Chelan. The Concert will feature the Festival Chorus, the Festival Wind Ensemble and a Haydn Symphony.

The Pavilion was completed in 2002, and has been used for a wide variety of performances in the past two years. Audiences have enjoyed Mariachi, Folk, Bluegrass, Big Band and Blues Groups, along with Chelan Valley Players, Community Band and Chorus performances, and open mike talent nights.

2003 performances also included Greenstage, a Shakespeare Troupe from Seattle, who treated an appreciative Chelan Audience to a wonderful performance of "The Merchant Of Venice".

The Pavilion was funded by the Citizens of Lake Chelan Valley, through personal donations, and by the City of Chelan, the Port of Chelan County, the State of Washington Department of

Trade and Economic Development, Chelan County PUD, Rotary Club of Chelan, Campbell's Resort, North Cascades National Bank, the Community Foundation of North Central Washington, Lake Chelan Developers, the Lake Chelan Chamber of Commerce, Chelan Business Association, Pacific Northwest Bank and the Lake Chelan Mirror.

Programming for 2004 Bach Fest

The 2004 Bach Fest again features the music of Haydn and Bach.

The Festival opens with our Young Musician's Concert on the afternoon of July 11 at the North Shore Bible Church in Manson, followed that evening by the Gala Opening Concert featuring Bach's Suite No. 4, the Brandenburg Concerto No. 6, the Haydn Cello Concerto in C and Symphony no 59.

The Noon Chamber Concerts at the Chelan United Methodist Church will include the Dvorak Serenade on Thursday and the Opera will be presented on Friday, July 16, as the last Noon Chamber Concert.

Thursday evening's Evensong Service

at the Methodist Church will present the Bach Cantata no. 149.

Concert I on Friday in the Performing Arts Center will include Bach's Cantata No. 51, Dvorak's Serenade for Strings, the Bach-Ormandy Three Chorale Preludes, and Haydn's Symphony No. 103, the "Drum Roll".

Concert II on Saturday will be at the Pavilion, and is covered on page 1.

Concert III on Sunday afternoon in the Performing Arts Center will be devoted to The Creation, by Haydn.

We expect to continue the Chamber Music in the Garden of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church on weekday mornings; our programming for children,

with a special performance of the Opera just for children; and the Sunday Noon performance in Riverwalk Park, with Lunch available for purchase from the St. Andrew's Episcopal Women.

This again promises to be an exciting and entertaining Festival. Make your plans to attend now, and order your Season Tickets using the form at the bottom of this page.
