Celebrating its 6th year, the Pacific Baroque Festival has established itself offering world-class musical performances of Vivaldi, Bach, Handel, Haydn and their contemporaries. Artistically, the Festival has quickly become a premier cultural event, generating audience interest beyond the Victoria region.

Over the last 50 years, performances on period instruments have emerged as a respected component of the modern musical world. Audiences recognize period performances to be refreshing, enlightening and invigorating while renowned musicians have become inspired to revisit the interpretation of their own repertoire. European communities have drawn on this interest, establishing their own Festivals on this musical movement and successfully so. The Pacific Baroque Festival is now well positioned to bring Victoria an international reputation as a centre of period performance music.

This year's two additional concerts further develop the Festival's artistic intentions to provide the audience with a greater context to experience and understand the music of its featured composers. The Festival continues its free event at Christ Church Cathedral; attended by over 800 patrons, proving our community's musical depth.

The Pacific Baroque Festival is delighted to introduce to Canada, Bernard Foccroulle, the award winning organist and one of the world's foremost interpreters of Bach and Buxtehude. His recording on the Recarcer label of the complete organ works of Dietrich Buxtehude was released and in 2007 was awarded the Diapason d'Or as well as the Grand Prix de l'Académie Charles Cros in addition to other prizes.
