Highlights will include Jean Langlais' virtuosic étude for pedals alone played by Kimbrian Canavan (V), and Kevin Lee's (V) performance of Olivier Messiaen's spectacular 'Dieu Parmi Nous'. Admission is free to this recital and all are welcome.

2013 BACH FESTIVAL

This year's Bach Festival will run for two weeks, beginning with an opening lecture and organ recital on Friday 31 May at 6.30pm in Big School. Over the course of the festival there will be a number of events including: lunchtime concerts; a lecture by Mr Koen van Stade on "Symbolism in Bach"; a violin recital by Mr Richard Tognetti from the Australian Chamber Orchestra; a Baroque-inspired Term II concert; and the final two Bach Cantatas concerts. The first Cantatas concert will be held in Big School on Sunday 2nd June at 4.00pm and will include BWV 47, 109, 115 & 180. The festival will close with a very special concert on Sunday 16th June at 4.00pm held in the New Hall. This will be the final concert of the Bach 2010 project that has been running at the School for the past eight and a half years. Cantatas to be performed in this final concert include BWV 5, 70, 139 & 140 (the famous "Sleepers Awake"). This concert will feature the School Choir singing with the Sydneian Bach Choir and Orchestra. Both cantatas concerts will be co-directed by the former Director of Music, Mr Chris Shepard. Admission for all the other concerts in this series is free.
